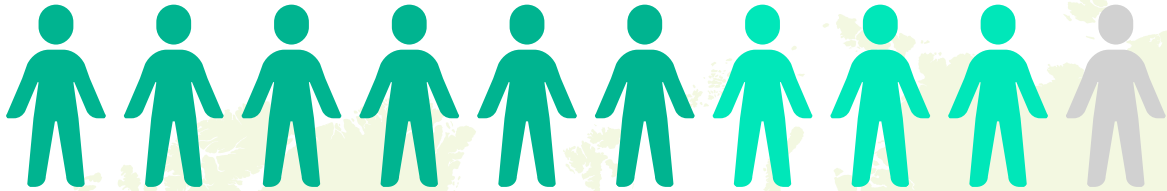

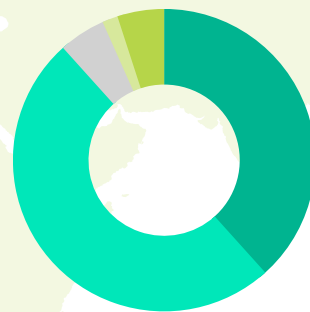
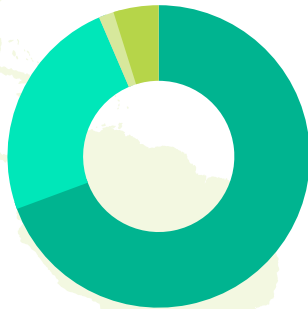
AT A GLANCE

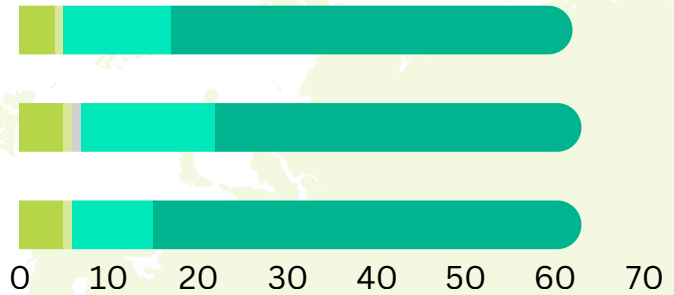

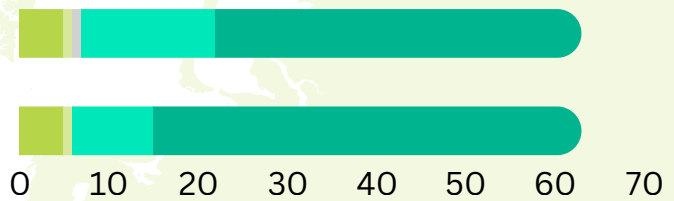

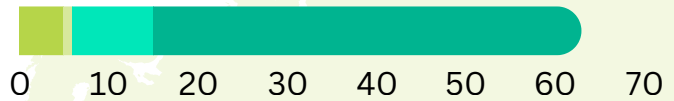
The registration process was easy to navigate.

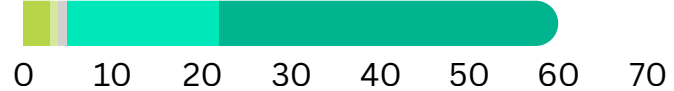

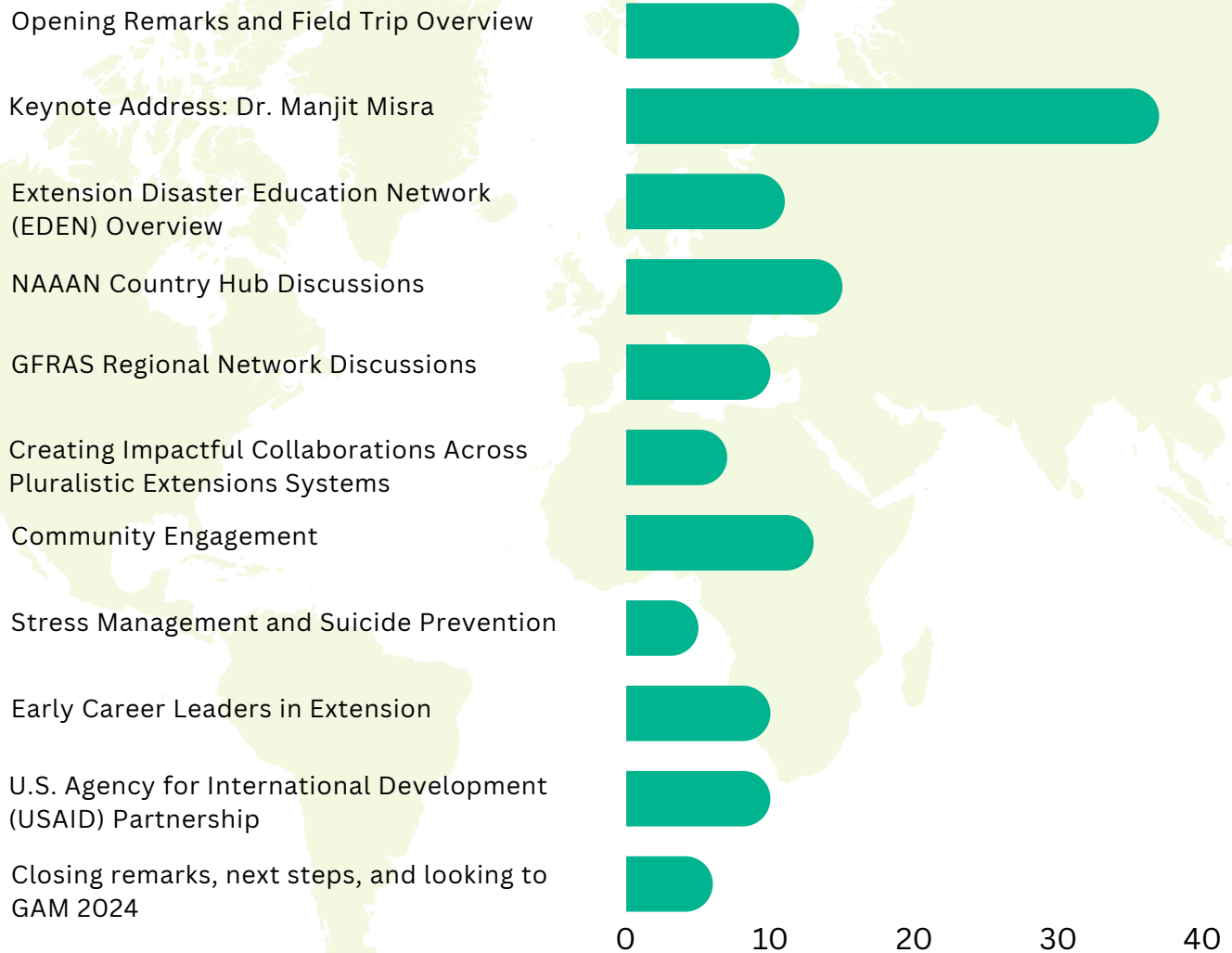
