

- Institutions, rather than individuals, are EDEN members.
- A land-grant extension institution or program becomes a member when the director or administrator names a point of contact and submits an EDEN Cooperative Agreement.
- EDEN is an alliance of land-grant extension services: 1862, 1890, 1994, Hispanic Serving Institutions, and NOAA Sea Grant Programs.

Structure

- Each institution has one point of contact (POC)
- Institutions may have additional delegates
- More than 300 dedicated "volunteers" representing more than 75 different areas of expertise
- One annual conference held per- year moves to different areas around the country
- Next one is Salt Lake City, Utah in October 2024




